
# Map of Hokkaido University Sapporo Campus





# Hokkaido University, founded in 1876, is a research-intensive establishment encompassing 12 undergraduate schools, 18 graduate schools



Front Cover: Dr. William Smith Clark of Massachusetts, USA, was the first Vice-Principal of Sapporo Agricultural College (the predecessor of Hokkaido University), and left an indelible footprint in the university's history. His message to students before he left Sapporo is well known throughout Japan and serves as the university motto: "Boys, be ambitious!"

#### **Must-See Sights on Sapporo Campus**

#### International Student Center

This center functions to provide Japanese language education and counseling services for overseas students and information to Japanese students wishing to study abroad.

#### Graduate School of Science

#### The Hokkaido University Museum

The Graduate School of Science building is the oldest permanent concrete building on campus, and houses the Hokkaido University Museum. It took two years to complete this three-story modern Gothic building starting in 1929.

#### Graduate School of Agriculture

This building is often featured in magazines as the representative of the university. Construction began in 1935, but because of the effects of World War II, it was not completed until 1960.

#### 64 Conference Hall

The Conference Hall was established in March 1985 in order to promote academic programs at the university. The Hall is used for academic activities such as conferences and symposiums.

#### 65 Centennial Hall

Built in 1978, the Centennial Hall houses an exhibition of one hundred years of university history in the form of photographs and documents. Other conference rooms and a cafeteria provide relaxed venues for both faculty and alumni gatherings. On weekdays the cafeteria is open and the restrooms and rest areas are available.

#### 66 Furukawa Hall

Furukawa Hall, completed in 1909, is one of the University's three designated Historical Buildings. Built with funds from the Furukawa Zaibatsu, this Dendrology (study of shrubs and trees) hall contains the only remaining greenhouse, animal husbandry room, preparation room, and agricultural chemistry classroom. Displaying the nobility of French Renaissance architecture, it now houses faculty members' research rooms.

#### 67 Hokkaido University Co-op

The Hokkaido University Co-op is open from 9:00 to 19:00 on weekdays and from 10:00 to 15:00 on Saturdays. Hokkaido University souvenirs and original items, i.e., T-shirts, pencil cases, etc. can be purchased here.

#### 69 Clark Memorial Student Center

A place for Students' discussions over tea was realized in 1960 with the construction of this western-style union building. The popular Student Center is the first and biggest of all national universities, and the pipe organ in the auditorium is on the same scale as that at the Tokyo University of Fine Arts and Music. On weekdays, the cafeteria is open and the restrooms and rest areas are available.

#### 73 Faculty House Trillium

This center opened in May 1995 as a place for academic staff to meet in an informal atmosphere to promote education and research activities, staff welfare and communication. It contains conference rooms, the restaurant ELM, a lounge and a gallery. On weekdays, the restrooms and rest areas are available and the restaurant is open.

#### 6 Enyuu Gakusha

Based on the work of Enyuu Night School, established in January 1894, by NITOBE Inazo and his wife, Enyuu Gakusha has become a new symbol for the campus, heading into the 21st century. It was donated to Hokkaido University in September 2001 on the occasion of the 125th anniversary of the university. Staff and students are able to hold small seminars, talks, fireside chats, exhibitions, and indoor concerts that will allow all members of the community, alumni, past staff members and the citizens of Sapporo alike, to relax, stroll, and interact with visitors from afar.

#### Information Center

The Information Center, newly constructed in 2010 for campus visitors, is just inside the main gates of the Sapporo campus. Inside, visitors can browse information regarding campus events as well as enjoy refreshments on the outdoor wood patio. The Information Center also carries original Hokkaido University merchandise.

#### 85 Sakushukotoni River

The water in this ancient river began to decrease and finally dried up due to the development of the upper area of the river around 1951. However, to celebrate the university's 125th anniversary, it was decided to bring this river back to life, and with support from the City of Sapporo, water began to flow again in 2004. It was the first step toward creating an Eco-Campus where the natural environment and educational research activities co-exist.

#### 66 Central Lawn

The Central Lawn maintains some of the local natural beauty of more than a century ago. The stream used to flow from a spring near the Botanic Garden and was dammed each winter until 1935 for the skating club's practice rink. Fewer botanical species grow now, but the fresh Kentucky bluegrass lawn surrounded by black alder, elm, and maple trees echoes the tranquil past.

#### 87 Bust of Dr. William S. Clark

William S. Clark came from Massachusetts to become Vice Principal of the germinal university in its founding year from August 1876 to April 1877. He helped introduce farming techniques suitable to Hokkaido conditions, and broadened students' minds to the outside world and to the spiritual sense of Christianity. The present statue erected in 1948 was modeled on the original which was melted down for metal during World War II,

#### **88** Old Library

The Old Library was built in 1902, and for the sixty-odd years until the present library building was built in 1965, it served as the central library, maintaining an open-shelf system library for the Faculty of Agriculture until 1991. Since then it has served as Center for Sustainability sciences, Sustainability Governance Project and Hokkaido University Press.

#### 89 Elm Grove

Around 900 elm trees growing on campus, among them many giant elms dating back more than a century, draw on the abundant underground waters.

### 90 Monument to First Artificial Snow

On this site in 1936, Dr. NAKAYA Ukichiro successfully produced the world's first artificial snow crystal. Discovery of the mechanism of snow crystals brought him the Prize of the Japan Academy, and numerous other pioneering discoveries paved the way for the establishment of the university's institute of Low Temperature Science.

#### Poplar Avenue

Poplars were first planted in Hokkaido in 1890's as a wind break. Many of the trees are far past their normal lifespan of sixty years, and despite the danger of them crashing down, they are an essential part of the Sapporo tourist's itinerary. A typhoon blew down nearly half the region's poplar trees in September 2004. However, support in the form of donations from many people helped restore some of the fallen trees, and new young ones were planted.

# 95 Gingko Avenue

Seventy gingko trees line the 380 meters of Kita (North) 13-jo Street as it extends into the campus. Aged between sixty and seventy years old, they form an orderly sentinel, and in autumn, when their leaves turn gold, present a splendid view.

#### Site of Old Village

In the 9th and 10th centuries a village was located in this area where people lived in pit dwellings and used Satsumon-style earthenware, a special style found only in Hokkaido. About thirty examples of pit dwellings are preserved on this site.

#### Model Barr

This Important Cultural Property was built in 1877, based on Dr. Clark's belief that successful farming depended on spacious stables to shelter animals from the severe winters. The barn was one of nine buildings, including silo, bull-house, milking shed, and tool shed built in the style of 19th century American barns. It was moved to the present site in 1910, and extensive restoration was carried out in 1977-79. There is a restroom located outside this building.

#### Botanic Garden

About a kilometer to the south of the campus is the Botanic Garden, containing a museum of Ainu relics, a Bachelor Museum, and many thematic gardens. Small wildlife abounds in this urban oasis. (Please refer overleaf for Botanic Garden information.)
